Each program is designed to encourage children to build upon learned skills and previous learning and experiences, with opportunities to reflect, revisit and connect.

trusting relationships

In our program, children develop trusting relationships with nurturing and experienced teachers who show children respect, and interact with them in caring and individualized ways. Every day, our teachers listen to the children, get down to their level, hug them, calmly implement

Young children discover the world through their senses, exploring with materials, moving throughout the classroom, and interacting with one another. To take advantage of their natural motivations and their sense of wonder and curiosity about the world around them, our teachers create hands-on, active learning experiences. We emphasize experimentation and problem-solving through investigation and collaboration, focusing on the process of learning, rather than the end product.

positive learning environment










CURRICULUM is the heart and soul of any learning program.

Application and Onboarding Process

- 1. Being the process of joining our team by emailing us your resume to michelleg@impressionableyears.com.
 You can also apply thru our website @www.impressionableyears.com or apply on Indeed.
- 2. After reviewing your resume and application, we'll contact you to schedule an interview if you seem to be a good fit for our team.
- 3. You may be asked to provide lesson plans, writing samples, and other documentation.



- 4. During your interview you may meet our director and members of our leadership team.
- 5. If your experience and skill set match our need, we may ask you to come in for a supervised working interview in a classroom (typically 2 hours). We may ask to you prepare a brief learning activity to do with the children.
- 6. After assessing your interviews, checking references, and completing background check we will make a decision about your fit. We will call to offer you the position, or let you know we selected another candidate.
- 7. In the first 2 weeks orientation period you will complete paperwork, training, classroom time, staff mentor or buddy, on site or off site classes, videos, and reading.
